Future meetings

Activities have started for the organization of the second IPSO/APSA meeting, to be held in Ponte Vedra Beach Florida, USA, in May 26-29, 2004. The theme of the combined meeting will be The 'Unresectable' Tumor. Put the dates in your agenda, and start thinking about subjects for your abstracts! All abstract submission will be online at www.eapsa.org but the abstract link will not be online until the end of August. The deadline for abstract submission will be Oct.31. Registration will also be available online at www.eapsa.org but probably not before February or March 2004.

MPO, the official Journal of IPSO and SIOP

In January 2004, Medical Pediatric Oncology will include the Hematologic Diseases of Childhood. This expanded Journal will continue as Pediatric Blood and Cancer (PBC), and will thereby also become the official Journal of the American Society of Pediatric Hematology/Oncology. In the coming months, the Executive Council will try to make sure that the new Journal remains accessible for surgical papers at the same threshold.

Presidents corner

While many of you may be enjoying what remains of the Summer, preparations continue for the SIOP and IPSO meeting this Fall. Attendance at this meeting is likely to be smaller than prior meetings but those that brave the trip to Cairo will be rewarded with an excellent program and meeting. Larry Hadley, our program director, has assembled a stimulating program thanks in part to those that have submitted many fine abstracts. The venue itself will be incomparable. There are a number of important issues that will need to be discussed and resolved at the Cairo meeting, including the merger of the *MPO* and the *Journal of Pediatric Hematology/Oncology* and our future relationship with the new journal *Pediatric Blood and Cancer*, the upcoming joint meeting with APSA in May 2004 and our future relationship with that and other organizations. Elections will be held for president-elect and to replace outgoing members of the executive committee. Altogether it will be a busy, stimulating and rewarding week for those that come as we renew old and make new friendships, share the experience and knowledge that advances our craft and see new people and places. I look forward to seeing you there.
