This present year 2009 is 'year 2' in the three year cycle of topics covered by the IPSO/EUPSA oncology course (attendance at all 3 annual components entitles the candidate to a certificate of completion of the full course). Excellent presentations were given by Sandeep Agrawala on thoracic tumours, Dan Aronson on liver tumours, Giovanni Cecchetto on germ cell tumours, and Dermot Murphy on statistics. Other members of the faculty (Dawn Penman, Robert Carachi, Larry Hadley and Roly Squire) provided support to the presentations, and took part in a tumour board discussion of problem cases. As previously a MCQ test was held at the end, primarily to reinforce the main educational messages of the day.

The course was very well received, and we will be looking forward to an equally successful day at the EUPSA meeting in Berne, which will be held on Wednesday 2 June, 2010. Please bear this in mind when you are advising your trainees regarding training opportunities in children's surgical oncology. The increasing popularity of this course suggests that it would be wise to book early. Details will be available through the EUPSA website.
